However, having the opportunity to share what the Word says about how we should live and love is the biggest blessing I took away from being a family group leader.

Because the president of the BCM, Kayla Telano, got to see my leadership capabilities in both the Social Cluster and as a family group leader, she asked me to be the leader of CWOM.


